## BIBLE STORY

The Triumphal Entry  
Matthew 21:1-11

## BIG TRUTH

God is Worthy.  
Only He deserves all glory.

## NOTE TO PARENTS

This year, we are going to use our Timeline to walk through God's Big Story in the Bible. This is the story of God and His people. It is the story of God rescuing His children and making a way for them to be with Him forever. It is the story that makes up the whole Bible. The Bible is one book made up of thousands of stories that all point to who God is and what He has done.

As we walk through God's Big Story this year, we will learn some of God's attributes. An attribute is a word that tells us what someone or something is like. God tells us who He is and what He is like in the Bible, His true Word. Every story, person, place, and event in the Bible is true. Each week we will learn stories about God, and these stories will show us who God is.



## TIME

Centering the home on God's Word

After this week's lesson, ask:

1. What attribute of God did you learn about today? *God is worthy.*
2. What does it mean for God to be worthy? *Only He deserves all glory.*
3. What is unique about Jesus that makes Him worthy? *Jesus is God the Son and He lived a perfect life which makes Him the perfect sacrifice for sin.*
4. If God is worthy of all glory, then how do we glorify Him? *We glorify God by showing, honoring, and enjoying Him as most valuable.*

**Read Psalm 63:3-4 as a family.** Talk about which testament, book, chapter, and verse this passage is found in.

1. What words in this passage do you not recognize or understand?  
*steadfast — immovable*
2. How does the psalmist respond to the steadfast love of God? *His lips praise God, he says he will bless the Lord as long as he lives, and he lifts up his hands to God.*
3. Why would the psalmist do this?  
*Because God is worthy. Only He deserves all glory,*
4. Is it hard to want to give God all of the glory?
5. As a family, how can we start our day together giving God glory?
6. As a family, how can we remind one another that God is worthy of all glory?

## MOMENTS

Proclaiming the truth as you go

- Choose a hymn that you love as a family. Listen to that all week together and sing praises to God because He is worthy.
- Using construction paper and scissors, create three images that you can hang up in your home to remind you of Holy Week. Make a palm branch, a cross, and a rock. The palm branch represents Jesus' Triumphal Entry. The cross represents Jesus' death on the cross. The rock represents the tomb that Jesus was buried within. On one side of the rock write, "He is risen!" Save what you have made, so on Easter morning, you can turn the rock around and praise Jesus together!

**SERVE** Make a baked good together as a family to celebrate who Jesus is and why He came. Give this to another family and tell them of the good news of Jesus!

**PRAY TOGETHER AS A FAMILY** Praise God that He is worthy! Thank Him for sending Jesus to save sinners and be the perfect sacrifice for sin. Confess that it is hard to want to give God all of the glory and not take some of it for yourself. Ask Him to help you to give Him all of the glory because only He is worthy.
